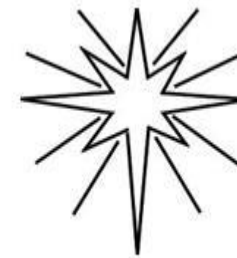

LETTER FROM THE VICAR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The message of Jesus Christ is made available to all people regardless of backgrounds. This shift was marked by the revelation of Jesus Christ as God's Son to the world through the visit of the Wise Men, who recognised him as King. So, as we celebrate the Feast of Epiphany this Sunday, let us open our eyes and our churches to what God is revealing to us through Jesus.
