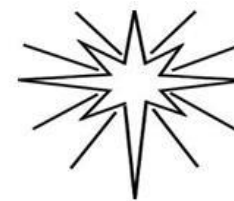

VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Black History Month: Dr Jacob Kurien, Chair of Racial Justice Action Group, Diocese of St. Albans shared this for Black History month:

"Let us take time this October to reflect on the rich stories and heritage of Black communities in our churches in a manner our communities wish to reflect, commemorate, and celebrate. What is important is that we do something this October in recognition of the significance of the Black History Month whether it is a brief reflection or a simple celebration of the richness of our diversity over a cup of tea and biscuits on a single day in the month of October or something much larger.

More importantly, we might consider including prayers and resources in our worship services that honour this history and celebrates our diversity that enriches our shared life of faith. Black History Month also provides an opportunity for reflection on how we can continue to listen to and uplift Black voices in our parishes. It's a chance to work together with others, building inclusive communities where everyone feels welcomed and valued. Let us therefore make Black History Month this year a meaningful time of remembrance, reflection, and celebration."
